Environment & Energy Congressional Round-Up | May 13 - May 17, 2024

Highlights:

The House passed the *Promoting Resilient Supply Chains Act of 2023* (H.R.6571). Reps. Larry Bucshon (R-Ind.) and Lisa Blunt Rochester (D-Del.) introduced the bill, which would <u>strengthen</u> domestic supply chains through improved mapping and monitoring—including for the critical minerals required for clean energy technologies. Critical materials for clean energy were discussed during EESI's <u>briefing</u> on the 2024 Sustainable Energy in America Factbook.

The Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources passed the *Continental Divide Trail Completion Act* (<u>S.594/H.R.1317</u>). The bill, introduced by Sens. Martin Heinrich (D-N.M.) and Steve Daines (R-Mont.) and Reps. Joe Neguse (D-Colo.) and Teresa Leger Fernández (D-N.M.), would <u>expedite</u> completion of the scenic Continental Divide Trail, simultaneously increasing outdoor recreational opportunities, improving public trail <u>access</u>, and creating economic opportunities for local communities.

Sen. Maria Cantwell (D-Wash.) and seven bipartisan cosponsors reintroduced the *Fire Ready Nation Act* (<u>S.4343</u>). The bill would establish a program within the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to improve forecasting, detection, modeling, and monitoring of wildfires, fire-inducing weather, and associated risks. EESI's podcast, *the Climate Conversation, explores* how increased wildfire modeling and risk assessment can improve wildfire mitigation.
