Environment & Energy Congressional Round-Up | September 19 - September 23

Highlights:

Last week, the Senate ratified the <u>Kigali Amendment to the Montreal Protocol</u>. The Kigali Amendment initiates a "gradual phasedown" of hydrofluorocarbon (HFC) production and use. To read more, check out EESI's <u>press release</u> on the amendment.

Meanwhile, the House passed the <u>Little Manatee Wild and Scenic River Act</u> (H.R.4358), which would designate a section of that Florida river to be potentially added to the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System.
